Acceptable for travel/accommodation for club presidents etc. to attend club related things that shall benefit the entire club.

Priority for more funding towards safety gear/ safety training courses/conferences.

Money for uniforms and equipment. Based on size of club and how many they need. Require more than one direct quote. Should OUSA be trying to get a cheaper deal for uniforms for clubs and have a recommended supplier? At the moment giving \$1000.00 for uniforms and basing equipment on a case-by-case basis. Perhaps require/suggest clubs to take a bond for uniforms/equipment loaned out to members?

Cultural nights, competitions, fundraising evenings, community projects etc., venue hire and costs for events. At the moment \$1000.00.

Conferences/events at recognised national or international institutions. Not academic based though. This is at the panel's discretion but should take into account the applicant's path of study.

What is the event/activity/project?

The Otago University Snow Sports Club would like to establish a set of harnesses and nutcrackers for the free use of all club members, in order to facilitate an environment where beginner skiers and snowboarders can be taught to use rope tow lifts at non-commercial ski fields.

Please explain the event/activity/project:

This project is part of a wider Club initiative to help provide students with access to the more remote and less easily assessable Ski Fields that New Zealand has to offer. Club Ski fields truly are an integral part of the New Zealand skiing culture, but are difficult to access because they are geographically remote, often require onmountain accommodation, and also lack the maintained roads of commercial mountain resorts. While our organised club trips will provide access and accommodation, the rope tows that exist in place of chair lifts are also one of the major barriers to beginner users of Club Fields.

The rope tow, in its most basic form, is a tractor engine that uses a pulley system to spin a long loop of rope from the bottom to the top of the snow hill (a classic piece of Kiwi ingenuity!). Skiers and snowboarders require a harness and the attached 'nutcracker' to clasp onto this as they are pulled up the slope. However, rope tows can be uncomfortable on the body and are notoriously difficult to use, which puts people off from using them and from embracing the New Zealand Club Ski Field experience, which truly is a gem!

Nutcracker belts can be hired from Club Ski Fields for a relatively low cost, but these literally are just wide leather belts with a clasp attached. In most cases, harnesses cannot be hired. The issue with nutcracker belts is that they ride up while being towed, causing the pull to come from the chest rather than the waist, and making it very hard to stay on the rope tow. This is actually dangerous because of the forces involved, and makes their use very difficult for advanced riders, let alone beginners! A set of harnesses, which have built in leg straps to maintain their position on the waist, would absolutely make the tows easier and safer to use, which is an important aspect of our goal to make these areas accessible for beginners, as well as the more advanced club members.

How many students will the uniform benefit?

All current and future active members of the club will benefit from this grant. We take between 30 and 50 students on our weekly club ski trips, and students attending these will be able to use the harness kits for free. This will save members from having to pay to hire the poor quality tow belts at the mountain rental shop. We plan to purchase more in the next few years to allow for members to use them outside of club trips too. This will ensure that all members are able to enjoy the weekends as much as possible, and will continue to provide low cost skiing to club members, which is in line with our goal of making skiing and boarding accessible for all levels of ability.

Dear Panel Members,

I support the application of the Otago University Snow Sports Club for the purchase of 30 rope tow harnesses and nutcrackers. The club and its members will benefit greatly from this grant, as it will help to provide the necessary equipment for skiing and boarding at the remote Club Ski Fields in New Zealand.

Basic tow belts that can be hired from Club Ski Fields are not adequate for beginners and will not help to facilitate their involvement in the sport. Providing appropriate equipment, and teaching members how to use it correctly, will be a significant step in the club's medium term goal of increased beginner involvement. It also makes more sense financially to purchase this equipment, rather than to have a requirement for members to hire sub par equipment from the rental shops indefinitely.

Despite being an advanced skier, I broke my finger under a pulley just last year because I couldn't react fast enough when the basic tow belt slipped up my back. I think this really highlights the difficulty that these basic belts impose on rope tow use, and is an issue that the 30 harness kits would solve.
