We playlist approximately 70% New Zealand music content across the station and have an annual intake of approximately 100 student volunteer programmers

Position Purpose:

• Work collaboratively across Radio One 91FM and Critic Te Ārohi to pitch, script, shoot, and edit video content for the Student Media Team, including both planned and ad hoc projects such as gigs, interviews, and vox pops, with the long-term goal of monetising content.

- Collaborate with both teams to produce and publish weekly video content on social media, aligned with current trends, news, advertising, and promotional opportunities.
- Edit and transform raw footage captured by volunteer videographers into engaging, high-quality, publishable content.
- Amplify and represent the voices and perspectives of Dunedin students through video storytelling, ensuring those voices are brought to the forefront of online discussion.

Host regular content-planning meetings with the Radio One manager and Critic Editor. Collaborate with Radio One Promotions and Content Coordinator on all content. Coordinate any video team volunteers. Lay out schedules for working a month in advance and maintain these deadlines. Maintain and care for all video equipment. Accompany volunteer videographers on video shoots and appear on camera or behind the camera when needed. Turn footage created by videographers into publishable material. Post videos to social media and monitor presences for both teams, in conjunction with other staff. Take personal responsibility for engaging in OUSA's no-harm, health and safety culture Be familiar with the hazard register for the work area that you work in Communicate to the Critic Editor, R1 Manager and colleagues any potential hazards that you identify that are not on the register. Be familiar with the location of first aid kits and qualified first aiders in the Association. Be familiar with and adhere to any health and safety plans.
